Singapore's expenditure in 2016 was \$73.43 billion. About half of it was spent on social development such as education (\$12.8 billion) and health (\$11 billion).



## Cut military expenditure by 20 per cent

Military expenditure hit \$13.21 billion in 2016. This made up 94.56 per cent of Mindef's total expenditure. The bulk of it went to the Singapore Armed Forces (SAF). Cutting spending in this area by 20 per cent will save the Government \$2.64 billion. The SAF, however, is one of the key pillars of our nation's anti-terrorism effort. Reducing their budget may reduce their effectiveness. Read more here.



### Cut manpower expenditure by 10 per cent

The Government spent \$8.67 billion on manpower in 2016. This made up 11.81 per cent of total expenditure. Out of that sum, \$45 million and \$22 million were spent on political and parliamentary appointments respectively. The bulk of the expenditure (95.85 per cent) was on permanent staff. Reducing the number of staff may reduce the Government's efficiency. Read more here.



#### More healthcare subsidies

The Ministry of Health's expenditure on social transfers to individuals was \$1.06 billion in 2016. A 10 per cent increase in this expenditure will cost the Government \$0.11 billion. The additional funds can be used to provide more coverage under schemes such as Medifund and ElderShield. More subsidies can also be given to those in need, such as the disabled. Read more here.

#### Smaller class sizes

The Ministry of Education's expenditure on permanent staff was \$4 billion in 2016. This made up 5.45 per cent of total expenditure. Hiring more teachers will increase expenditure, but may allow for smaller class sizes and a lower student-teacher ratio, which may mean more attention for each student. In 2015, the average class size for primary and secondary schools were 33.5 and 34.3 respectively. Read more here.
