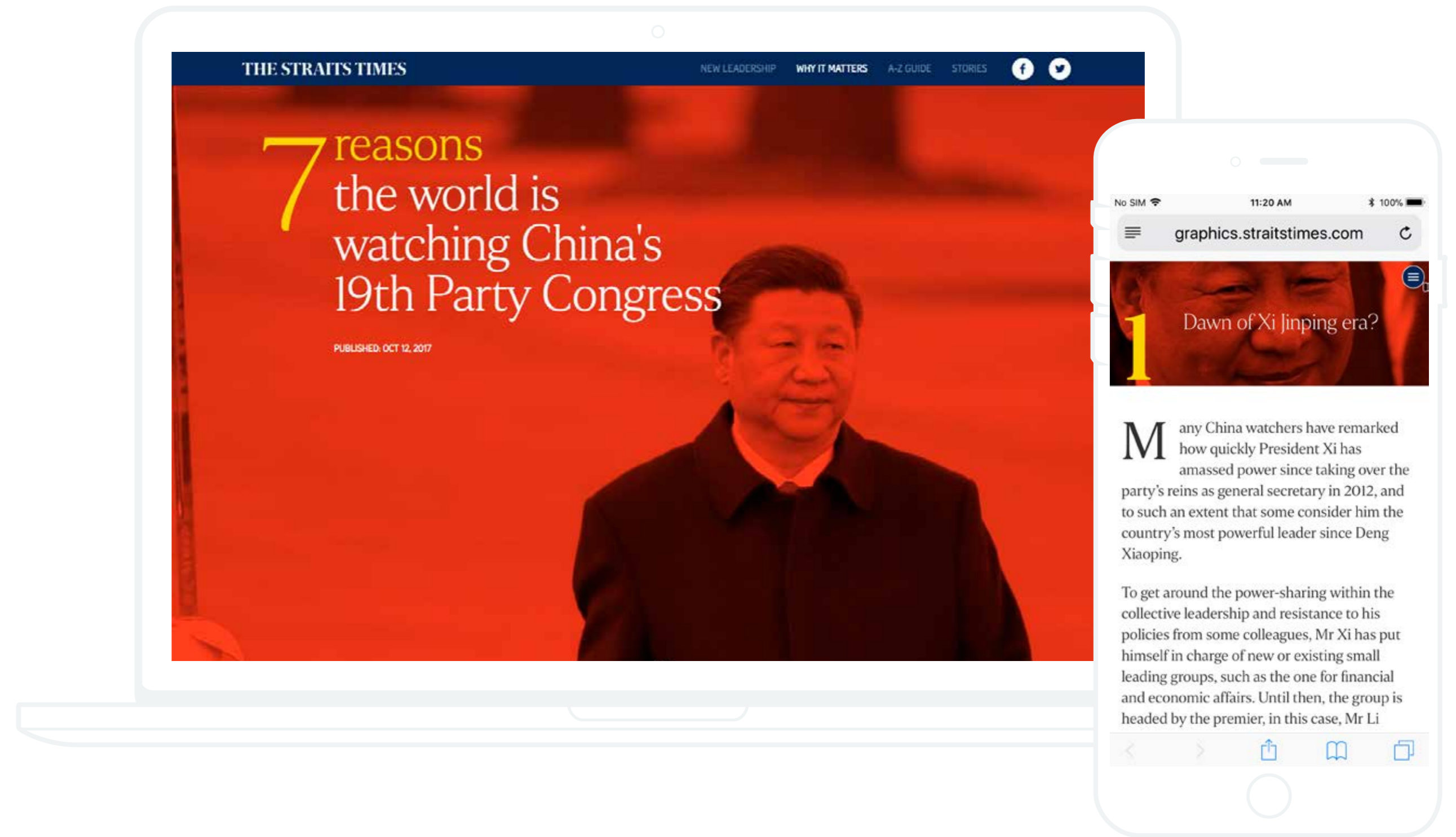

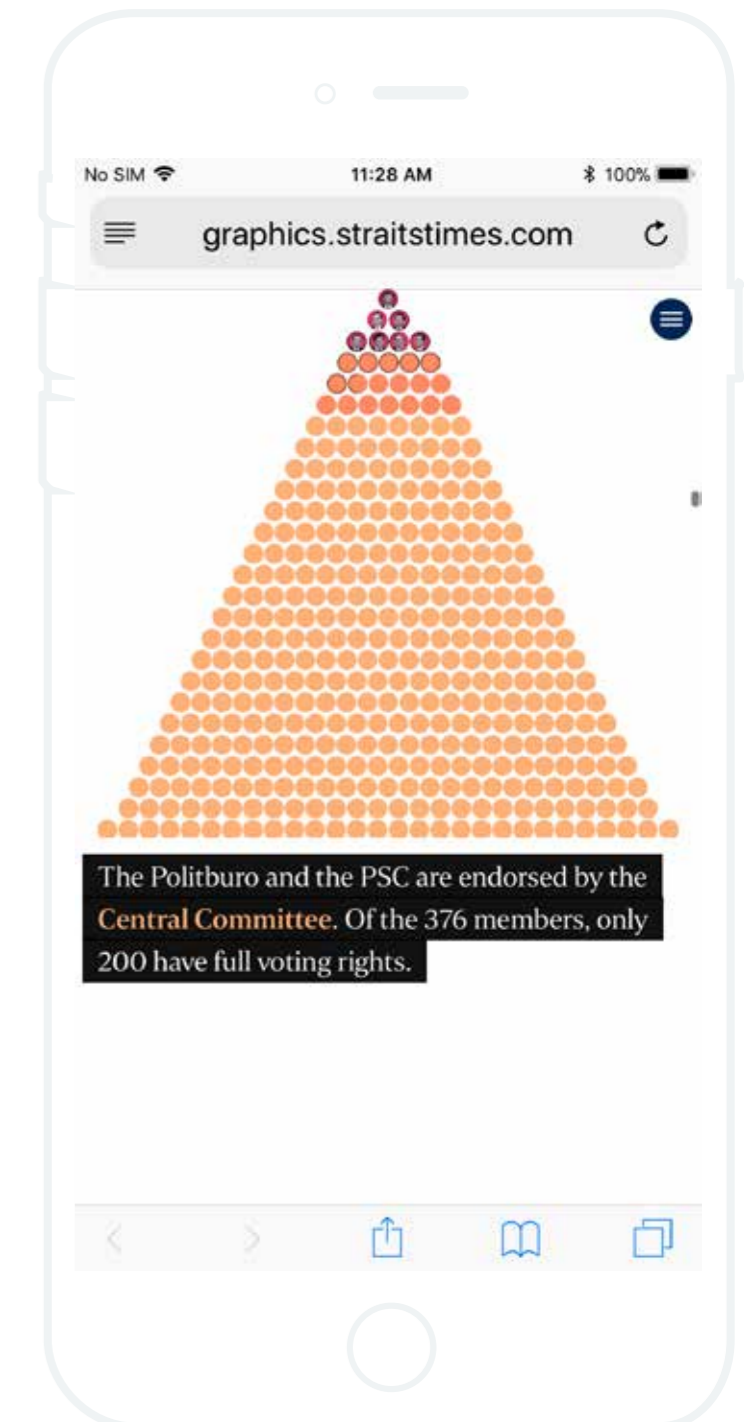
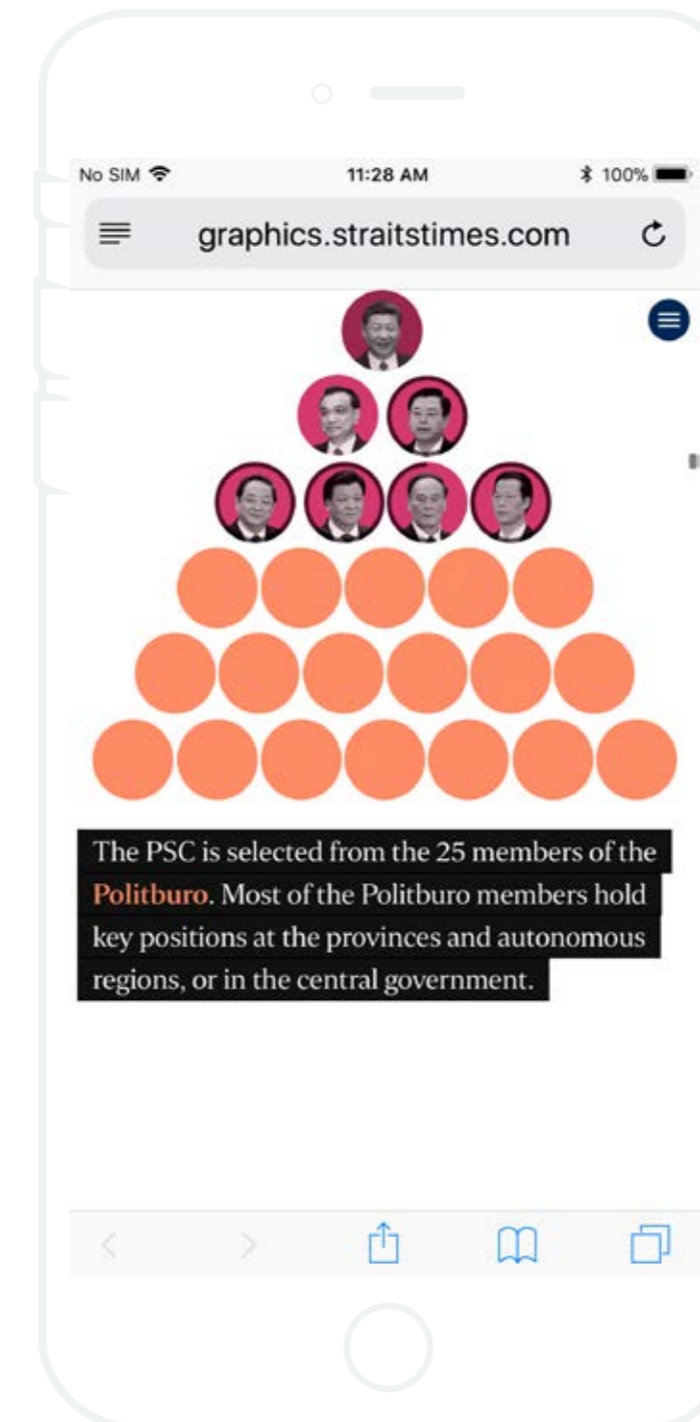

Who's who on the Politburo Standing Committee




1. Xi Jinping, 64 (President)

Became top leader in the Chinese leadership in 2012. Mr Xi has consolidated enough authority to be considered the most powerful Chinese leader since Deng Xiaoping. Named "core" leader of the CCP in October 2016, he will be closely watched for whether he will identify potential successors at this party congress, or if he intends to break succession norms to pursue a third term as President.



2. Li Keqiang, 62 (Premier)

The supposed No. 2 and head-of-government. His key portfolios include economic management and finance. But Mr Li, widely seen as an ally to former president Hu Jintao, has had his power reduced. Mr Xi has taken over more decision-making roles through the formation of high-level steering committees.



3. Zhang Dejiang, 70 (NPC Chairman)

An administrator whose regional governance experience is unmatched by his standing committee peers. Mr Zhang is also the top official responsible for Hong Kong and Macau, and considered an ally of former

3 So, who will be Mr Xi's men?

Arguably, the most keenly watched event will be the unveiling of the members of the PSC on the last day of the party congress.

And instead of the current seven members, there might just be five this time.

There has been speculation Mr Xi might reduce the number so as to ensure a majority of his allies are in the line-up and to avoid having to name successors-in-training to the team as has been the unwritten norm.

Observers believe he would like to keep Mr Wang Qishan, his anti-corruption czar and a

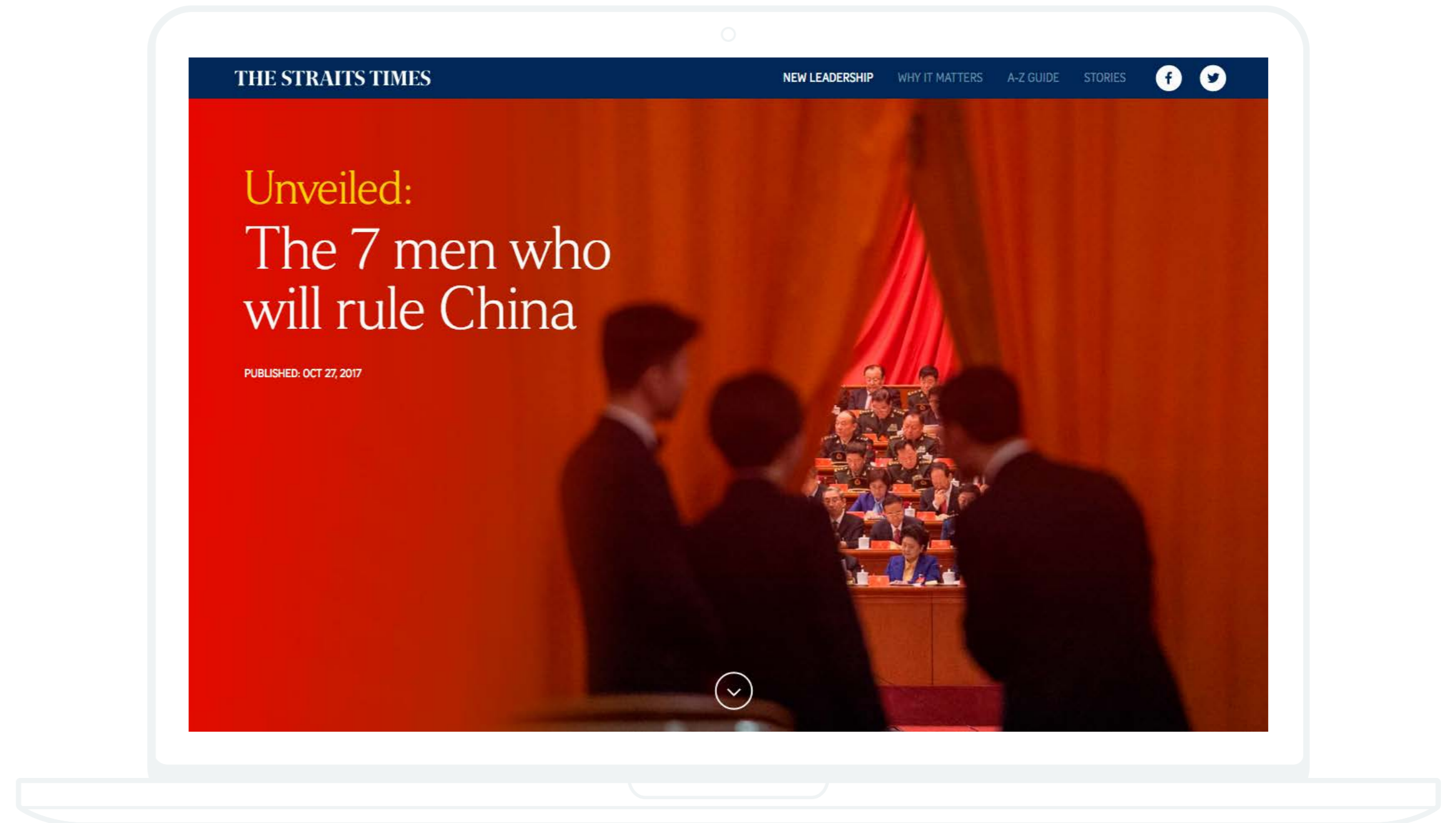
